## YouthGiving.org Style Tips:

To be consistent with our brand platform, we ask that you use these style guidelines when writing about YouthGiving.org!

- Short-hand style: YouthGiving.org (capitalize the Y and G)
- Long-hand style: YouthGiving.org, a project of Foundation Center
- YouthGiving.org’s voice is optimistic, friendly, dynamic, caring, and passionate.
- YouthGiving.org is a place that welcomes all those interested in youth grantmaking-- regardless of age, experience level, or existing knowledge

## Features:

- **Funding Map:** The data set on the funding map includes foundation funding from 2001 to the present in support of youth philanthropy programs and data on grants made by youth grantmakers in those programs to organizations in their communities (“youth-driven grants”). At launch these “youth-driven grants” totaled more than 3,500 grants worth over \$14.7 million dollars and the data set is constantly growing!

- **Program Directory:** The program information compiled in the program directory was collected from websites and direct outreach to organizations active in youth grantmaking. This directory collects and shares information about youth giving programs around the world to foster connection and collaboration.
- **Resources:** The resources in our Learn section are pulled from IssueLab, which works to more effectively gather, index, and share the collective intelligence of the social sector. The collection includes case studies, videos, reports, and other resources useful to those engaged in youth philanthropy or looking to get involved in the youth giving movement.
- **Expert Posts:** Our expert posts aim to share strategies, approaches, tips, and tools that build knowledge and catalyze the youth giving movement worldwide.
